# Parent Information



The Macomb Infant Preschool Program (MIPP) is a special education *Early On®* program operated by the Macomb Intermediate School District.

Early On offers early intervention services for infants and toddlers, birth to three years of age, with developmental delay(s) and/or disabilities, and their families.

Research has shown that by addressing delays early on, especially between birth and age 3, children have better outcomes, even into adulthood.

Developmental delays can include eating, dysregulation, negative behaviors, not talking, not playing with toys, not listening.

MIPP services are designed to provide ]information and guidance that will help families throughout their child's first educational experience.
